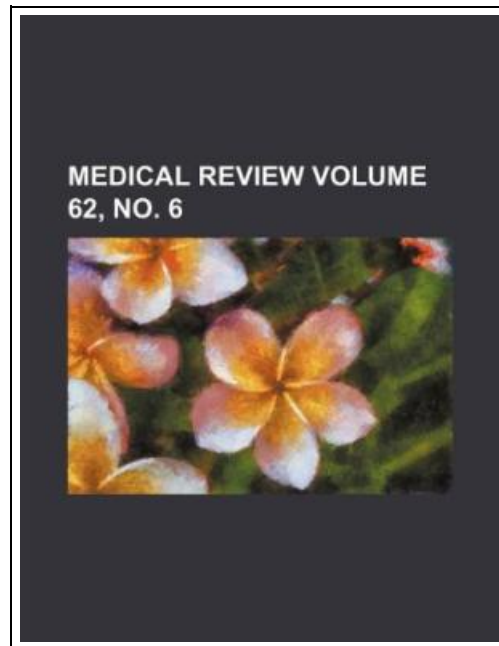

A few years later another scourge of the disease swept the city, causing the death of more than five hundred. As recently as 1885, Montreal, Canada, an unvaccinated city, in an epidemic of small-pox suffered the death of 3,164 by the disease, or about two per cent, of the inhabitants. Since then vaccination has been made compulsory for all school children. Now the city feels immune from another such scourge. It is credibly reported that in some parts of India before vaccination was practiced, fully eighty per cent, of the people bore the marks of small-pox, while since vaccination has been made compulsory, a case of the disease is extremely rare. Formerly, before vaccination became general, it was sometimes customary to place a person in as good physical condition as possible, by diet, etc., and then to inoculate with small-pox virus. It was almost certain that every person would have the disease at some time in their lives, and it was considered much better that a person should have the disease when prepared for it and expecting it than to be taken unawares. Now, in many countries, inoculation is forbidden by law. Germany was the first of the European countries to adopt vaccination. They have since been persistent and thorough. Since 1875 Germany has made it compulsory that every child before arriving at school age, six years, must be vaccinated, and...
